Connected Moments

Picture a warm, sunlit room filled with smiles and laughter. In one corner, a Veteran gently guides a child's hand as they look at a photo album, sharing stories of his youth while the child listens with wide eyes.

Across the room, a group of toddlers gathers around a great-grandmother, mesmerized as she reads them a story.

Nearby, an educator smiles as she watches a little girl eagerly showing a Grandfather a puzzle she is working on.

A long-retired teacher enters the room and greets a young boy by name. The boy responds with a smile and a hug, happy to see his grand-friend again.

Seniors can enrich the early learning experience in many ways. They can provide

patient assistance and warm hugs, prepare engaging activities, and greet children enthusiastically.

Even seniors who prefer less interaction can contribute to the children's joy, perhaps by setting up a surprise pile of leaves for children to jump in or playfully greeting them.

In these small moments of connection, something profound happens: children discover that older adults aren't so different from them, while seniors rediscover the spark of joy that comes from discovery and connection.

Expanding Warmth and Purpose

With your support, the *Bridging Generations* campaign will raise \$2 million to expand and transform Perley Health's intergenerational program. This funding will enable Perley Health to create purposebuilt spaces where interactions between seniors, Veterans and children flourish—spaces designed with warmth, accessibility, and community in mind.

With over a century of experience, Andrew Fleck Children's Services will manage and staff the childcare component. At the same time, Perley Health's expertise, enviable reputation and leadership in senior care ensure a seamless and enriching experience for all.

Campaign funds will go toward creating program rooms, activity areas, and outdoor spaces where seniors and children can engage in structured and spontaneous activities.

From crafting and storytelling to gardening and sharing meals, these spaces will be designed to remove barriers and unite the two generations in natural and impactful ways.

Perley Health's childcare program* will run seven days a week, from 6:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. and deliver mutual benefits: Children gain confidence, social awareness, and exposure to different generations. Seniors enjoy a sense of purpose, companionship, and the chance to contribute.

Both groups experience vibrancy and a sense of community through these interactions.

*The program will be part of the Canada-wide Early Learning and Child Care program, commonly known as the "\$10 per day child care."

Purpose-built spaces with thoughtful design elements will create a welcoming and inclusive senior environment:

- Wider doorways to accommodate wheelchairs and scooters.
- Comfortable adult-sized furniture.
- Soundproofing and acoustic design.
- An accessible kitchen area for shared activities.
- A retrofitted cubby area where seniors can assist children with outdoor gear.
- Dementia-friendly design principles.
- A wheelchair-accessible washroom.

Meeting Community Challenges

The *Bridging Generations* campaign also addresses a critical community need in Ottawa: an extreme shortage of accessible, affordable childcare, especially for healthcare workers with irregular hours.

Perley Health's expanded intergenerational program will be integrated with 49 childcare spaces, focusing on serving the children of Perley Health staff. By prioritizing the children of Perley Health staff, especially those with irregular healthcare shifts, this program will address a significant challenge for the healthcare workforce —accessible childcare.

Having exceptional childcare and early education from a trusted provider on-site

will make Perley Health a more attractive employer, aiding recruitment and staff retention. Healthcare workers, who often struggle with finding suitable childcare, will benefit from the convenience of having their children close by, contributing to work-life balance and a family-friendly work environment.

The peace of mind that comes with having their children well-cared for nearby will allow staff to focus more fully on their duties. This enhanced focus and reduced stress will directly translate to improved quality of care and a more positive experience for Perley Health's seniors, Veterans and their families.
